## TOP FACTS ABOUT LA SPEZIA

**Size:** 51.39 square kilometers (19.8 mi)

**Population:** 92,828

**Time Zone:** Central European Time (CET)

**Climate:** the highest temperatures are in the month of August and can be as high as 81°F (27°C). The cool season lasts for 4 months, from November to February, with an average daily high temperature below 57°F (14°C).

The city of La Spezia is one of the main Italian military and commercial harbours.

**Fun Fact:** The origin of the name “La Spezia” remains uncertain, with several theories proposed. One suggests it comes from the ancient word “hospitia,” meaning a place of hospitality or haven, reflecting the city’s role as a safe harbor. Another theory links the name to “expedio,” relating to the shipment of salt produced in the Gulf’s saltworks. While both ideas are plausible, the true origin of the name is still a mystery, adding to the city’s historical intrigue.

## LIFE IN LA SPEZIA

### SHOPPING FOR FOOD

#### **Markets**

In Italy, it's common to buy vegetables, fruits, cheese, bread and fish at local food markets. Be aware that some stands might not accept credit card payments so be sure to bring cash with you. The products at the market are usually very fresh and cheap!

#### **La Spezia Food Market**

This market is open Mon - Fri 8:30am - 7:30pm, Sat 8:30am - 2pm and 4:00pm - 7:30pm. It's closed on Sundays. In the afternoon you can find only vegetable and fruit stands.

#### **Mercato Ortofrutticolo e Ittico**

Piazza Camillo Benso Conte di Cavour

The market is morning-only. Mon-Sat 7:30am - 1:30pm. It's closed on Sundays.

#### **Supermarkets**

In Italy supermarkets can be quite small, especially in city centers, but in most of them you can find fresh bread, pastries and vegetables. Here are some of the most famous supermarkets you can find in La Spezia:

### **Special Dietary Needs**

**Vegetarian/Vegan:** Most stores have sections offering plant-based meals. NaturaSì is a store with good quality vegetarian and vegan food.



**Celiac disease:** Most stores have a dedicated gluten-free section. If not, you can check the back of the package for the certified gluten-free symbol to ensure the product is safe to consume.

## MONEY MATTERS

Electronic payment methods are widely accepted in Italy, but cash transactions are still commonplace. You should always carry a small amount of euros with you for small daily transactions. However, we strongly suggest that you do not carry large amounts of cash while in La Spezia, anywhere else in Italy or abroad. Only take with you what you need according to your plans for the day, and make sure the rest of your cash is kept somewhere safe. Most international debit and credit cards are accepted in Italy.

### Atm

ATM machines, or Bancomats, can be found outside most banks. Some locations may require you to enter by swiping your card through a reader as a safety precaution. Most bank machines have an option for instructions in English, and allow a maximum withdrawal of €250 per day. Please check with your home banking institution for specific information on service charges, maximum daily withdrawal amounts, and an updated list of associated bank ATMs. Generally speaking, cash machines in storefronts will charge higher fees.

### Exchange Services

There are several exchange offices in the center of La Spezia. Most are open seven days a week and offer both currency exchange and cash advance. If you need to have money wired to you while in La Spezia, the best way to do this is through services such as Western Union or MoneyGram.

You will need to use your full legal name as it appears on your passport.



## LUGGAGE STORAGE

We do not offer luggage storage services and students cannot leave their luggage in their apartments or at school between sessions for any reason. Please contact the Student Life Department for a current list of locations that provide storage services.



## CELL PHONES

For non-European citizens there are different options to have a working smartphone in Italy:

1. Buy a SIM card from one of the main phone companies operating in Italy: Vodafone, TIM, Wind/3, or PosteMobile. Most monthly plans vary between €15 - €20 for a combination of minutes, SMS, and data, PLUS the one-time cost of the SIM card (approximately €10 - €15). Although websites are mostly in Italian, staff on site will be able to help you in English.
2. Get an International Plan. You can do this through your phone company back home. You should contact them directly about costs. Make sure the plan you decide on works everywhere throughout Europe, not only Italy, mostly if you plan to travel around.
3. Buy an eSIM online. There are different apps and websites where you can do this (e.g. Airalo, Holafly). It's very simple

and the process can easily be done online. Additionally you don't need to change your current SIM card. In this case, also make sure to get a plan that lasts the whole length of your stay abroad and that works everywhere throughout Europe.

To make an international call from an Italian number dial:

To receive calls on an Italian number, make sure your caller dials their country's international access code, followed by 39 and your phone number. Examples of international codes to call Italy:

## **EXTRACURRICULAR ACTIVITIES**

### **WEEKLY ACTIVITIES**

#### **City Walks**

This series of activities allows students to maximize their experience in La Spezia through guided walks through the most significant neighborhoods in the city. Through this activity, students gain an understanding between the past and contemporary La Spezia, while exploring new neighborhoods they might not venture into on their own, connecting with both the urban territory and the community.

#### **Mind & Body**

“Mens sana in corpore sano”, a sound mind in a sound body, is the philosophy behind the Mind and Body series of activities. This series includes fitness opportunities meant to inspire and empower students through guided runs/power walks in new neighborhoods to help you keep fit and embrace the La Spezia terrain at the same time, as well as special workshops aimed at empowering students during the study abroad experience.



### **Sports Night**

This activity is a great way to keep in shape while expanding your knowledge of Italian fitness culture. Whether it's a soccer game, a volleyball match or an evening spent kayaking through the coast of La Spezia, it's a good opportunity for every student to get out and try something new.



### **Cineforum**

### **CONNECTING CULTURES: SEMESTER-LONG ACTIVITIES**

These activities are designed to enhance cultural awareness and guide students in their educational outcomes and personal growth during their time in La Spezia. Through Connecting Cultures, students have the opportunity to interact with the community of La Spezia.

#### **Chat Pal**

This language exchange activity connects Italians with students in order to facilitate a meaningful connection with a member of the community and, at the same time, improve your Italian language skills. The Chat Pal program requires conversation partners to meet at least once a week (one hour). Partners should speak in Italian for 30 minutes and 30 minutes in the student's native language. Specific time and locations are arranged between the partners.



## **Community Outreach**

This activity offers volunteer opportunities for our students within the community of La Spezia, allowing them to truly integrate and give back to their host city. Each of our partner associations is unique, and volunteers are often the fundamental element that keep these organizations in operation!

Most of the organizations do not require particular skills or the ability to speak Italian, but they all require a serious commitment from volunteers in order to accomplish their goals.

## **Weekend Activities & Trips:**

### **Educational Field Learning**

The mission of EFL (Educational Field Learning) is to provide students with first-hand learning experiences, leading them away from the typical tourist mindset and giving them the opportunity to experience Italy through a native perspective. EFL's aim is to create experiences rich in positive emotions, facilitating a cultural exploration and understanding of Italy.

EFL's Academic Field Learning enriches the content of courses in an enjoyable way, contextualizing the information received in class through hands-on involvement, site visits, participation in local events, and communication with other participants and Italians.

At the same time, EFL offers a well-organized and safe environment that makes the students feel as comfortable and secure as possible so far away from their home. EFL experiences are planned for a student budget, while providing very comfortable accommodations and travel arrangements (3 star hotels, private charter buses), as well as entrance to all the museums and guided tours.

### Museums to Visit in La Spezia

#### 1. CAMEC: Centro d'Arte Moderna e Contemporanea La Spezia

## Day Trips from La Spezia
